Sena and Jane Ounate-Lare in Togo

What's the Need?

Togo is a small country in West Africa. A large number of Togolese people are animist (worshipping idols and ancestors); about 15% of the population are Muslim; and about 30 % call themselves Christians (although only a few of these really know what it means to follow Christ).

Since January 2004, Sena and Jane have been working in Dapaong, in the poor northern region of Togo. Most people live in fear of idols, black magic and ancestors, and with a strong influence of Islam. People in Dapaong need to be set free by the Word, the truth and the love of God.

Why Sena and Jane?

Sena is from Togo, but lived in Paris for 15 years. It was there that he came to know the Lord. His wife, Jane, is English. They met each other while doing a two-year course in Biblical and Cross-cultural studies at All Nations Christian College, Hertfordshire, as preparation for overseas mission. They then worked with the pastoral team of Eglise Réformée de Belleville in Paris.

Sena and Jane, with their three children Joshua, Eloise and Johan, are based in Dapaong. They work with a Togolese Church called Ministère International de Jésus, which is committed to church planting and social work throughout Togo. As 70% of the Togolese population is under 30 they work a lot among young adults and students.

Sena and Jane are involved in a church-planting ministry, planting their first church in September 2004 with the view of planting three more by 2010. With the help of Benoit Ahonsou, a Crosslinks short-term project partner. They are also involved in Bible teaching and training of leaders in the town.
